Position Description

The CCR Program at the Centre for Addiction and Mental Health (CAMH) is seeking a part-time, temporary (1 year) Neuropsychologist.

The successful candidate will provide assessment and clinical consultation to inpatients and outpatients living with severe mental illness and developmental disability. The focus will be on assessments addressing questions of developmental disability, adaptive functioning, broader cognitive functioning, and care planning related to these and other issues. The role also includes training and supervision of other disciplines and trainees engaged in the service. Reporting to the Manager of the CCR Schizophrenia Specialty Clinics and the Clinical Lead of the neuropsychological assessment service, the successful candidate will play a crucial role in developing care plans for these populations. You will support a workplace that embraces diversity, encourages teamwork and complies with all applicable standards and regulatory requirements.

You will be asked to:

- Complete brief and full psychological or neuropsychological batteries
- Assess eligibility for specialty services (e.g. developmental services) and support application and appeals
 where appropriate.
- Contribute to clinical formulations and prepare concise reports for clinical teams and community stakeholders
- Consult on treatment/disposition planning
- Provide clinical training and supervision, and in services to families, clinicians, and direct care professionals.
- Contribute to research, clinical and educational initiatives as appropriate.

Qualifications

The successful candidate will have a Doctoral Degree in Clinical Psychology (or equivalent), and registration in good standing with the College of Psychologists of Ontario. The successful candidate will be a licensed to practice neuropsychology and will have experience with clients with severe mental illness. You will also have excellent interpersonal and verbal communication skills and function well within a cooperative, collaborative working environment. You have the ability for self-directed learning/working, while working concurrently on multiple projects. The successful candidate is able to work independently with minimal supervision, seeking advice and support when needed. You must be able to work effectively in a wide range of settings with individuals from diverse backgrounds. An excellent attendance record, consistency, and reliability should be demonstrated in your record of past employment and references.
