Unit Summary

The Acquired Brain Injury Program at Hamilton Health Sciences (HHS) is part of Rehabilitation and is located at the Regional Rehabilitation Centre. HHS is a regional trauma centre, and with an affiliation with McMaster University Medical Centre, there are opportunities to be involved in education and research in addition to your role as a clinical practitioner.

Position Summary

As an integral member of the clinical healthcare team, the Psychologist will provide services for acquired brain injury patients in both a fee-for-service environment and an outpatient clinic. Responsibilities will involve neuropsychological assessment, diagnosis and treatment. This includes preparation of treatment plans, scripts and reports; provision for expert consultation to other health care professionals regarding diagnosis and treatment strategies; provisions of psychological services to clients with post-concussive syndrome, depression, anxiety, post-traumatic stress, and with cognitive and behavioural issues. The position also involves program development, research, and teaching responsibilities.

The ideal candidate has a proclivity towards education and research, and is a person who thrives in a stimulating, creative, interdisciplinary clinical environment where neuropsychologists are considered an integral part of the clinical team. It is the congeniality among our team members, support staff, and management that contributes to our culture of support, growth and development. HHS provides neuropsychologists with an opportunity to connect and collaborate with other neuropsychologists and health professionals on a regular basis.
