Peel Children's Centre is an accredited children's mental health centre that provides a continuum of high quality mental health services for children, youth and their families who are experiencing social, emotional and/or behavioural challenges.

Annual salary range - \$82,989 to \$96,492 (5 step range)

This is a full time position with a generous total rewards package of 4 weeks' vacation in the first year, personal leave, group life/LTD/health/dental benefits that are fully employer paid and a defined contribution pension plan.

Job Summary

As a children's mental health centre, we offer our services within a multidisciplinary framework and the discipline of psychology plays a critical role. As part of a multidisciplinary team and reporting to a Clinical Manager, the successful candidate will provide psychological assessments and translate results into multidisciplinary treatment plans; provide case consultation to clinical teams and support the professional development of staff. Clinical services may be provided in office, home or community settings as required by client and program needs. Hours of work are flexible and are determined by client and program need.

In addition to providing a range of clinical services, the Psychologist will actively participate in the Centre's program evaluation, knowledge dissemination and clinical training activities. The Psychologist may oversee the services provided by Psychological Associates/Psychometrists, assisting with hiring and performance evaluation as required, and coaches, mentors and trains psychology staff and other clinical staff as required. This position may also supervises psychology graduate students.

Skills & Qualifications:

- Doctoral degree from a recognized university and registration or eligibility for registration with the College of Psychologists of Ontario;
- Minimum of three years directly related experience in a children's mental health setting;
- Proficiency in psychological assessment, including experience administering and interpreting psychometric measures used to assess children/youth and the ability to produce comprehensive reports, including detailed recommendations;
- Knowledge of interpretation of psychological or psychometric findings and ability to communicate diagnoses to clients, parents, agency, staff and community as required;

- Demonstrated ability to work effectively as an integral part of a multidisciplinary team to provide a unique perspective in case and program consultation;
- Experience with evidence-based/evidence-informed therapeutic interventions;
- Participate in program evaluations, research and continuous quality improvement initiatives;
- Demonstrated computer proficiency in information sourcing and report writing;
- Excellent communication skills, both written and oral;
- Excellent analytical and flexible problem solving abilities;
- Sound knowledge of relevant legislation;
- Valid Ontario driver's license and use of a vehicle, satisfactory Vulnerable Sector police records check.
- Knowledge and experience of providing assessment and consultation specifically for young children from infancy to age 6, including providing clinical support to staff in an early learning program setting for children presenting with emotional and developmental delays will be an asset.
