Psychologist, Inter-professional Team Permanent, part time position (17.5 hours per week)

Unison's mission is working together to deliver accessible and high quality health and community services that are integrated, respond to needs, build on strengths and inspire change. We are dedicated to providing high quality health care and community services and programs, with a focus on priority populations in North West Toronto.

We are working from an inclusive, sex positive, harm reduction, anti-racist, pro-choice, anti-oppression, and participatory framework in addressing the issue of access to health care for our mandated priority populations encompassing all the determinants of health.

At this time Unison is seeking a psychologist to work with clients who have a variety of mental health and/or substance issues. The successful candidate will have demonstrated dedication and enthusiasm for a collaborative approach within an inter-disciplinary care team.

Reporting to the Manager, Mental Health and Substance Use; the psychologist will work with an inter-professional team of physicians, nurse practitioners, community health nurses, social workers and addiction counsellors to develop and implement care plans for each client with measurable outcomes.

The successful candidate will have:

- A Doctoral or Masters degree in Psychology from an accredited APA or CPA program
- Completion of APPI, CPA, or CCPPP accredited internship/residency program
- Registration with College of Psychologists of Ontario
- Competency in Clinical and Rehabilitation scopes of practice
- Demonstrated experience in community-based primary care settings;
- Demonstrated knowledge of and sensitivity to the impact of social, economic, environmental and cultural issues on health;

- Excellent understanding of community resources in mental health and substance use treatment
- Experience in couples counselling is an asset
- Strong communication skills, both within and outside of treatment sessions and as part of an interdisciplinary team, with a respect for confidentiality requirements
- experience serving Unison's priority populations (seniors with complex needs, people with mental health and addictions, LBTTQ+, and youth facing barriers) is an asset;
- Intermediate computer skills including Excel, Word and email applications
- Ability to speak a second language is an asset
- Preference will be given to candidates who are available to work one evening per week.
