SYMPOSIUM OVERVIEW

Social Justice and Anti-Oppressive Work in School Focused Psychological Services

This symposium will focus on bringing a social justice and anti-oppressive orientation to the psychological work for children within and in conjunction with schools. Mental health disparities, institutional racism, and oppression affect all developing children and youth, both those from minoritized backgrounds and those who are part of the majority.

Working from a social justice framework and honoring the knowledge and wisdom that can be learned from the lived experiences of voices often unheard benefit all within the larger school and broader community. We will focus on specific strategies to selfevaluate and transform clinical practice into deliberately-oriented and anti-oppressive practice.

SYMPOSIUM PRESENTER



A.Jordon Wright, Ph.D, ABAP is a Clinical Associate Professor and Director of the Center for Counseling and Community Wellbeing, the community-based training clinic, at New York University. He has authored multiple texts on psychological assessment, including *Conducting Psychological Assessment: A Guide for Practitioners* (2nd ed.; Wiley, 2020), the *Handbook of Psychological Assessment* (6th ed.; Wiley, 2016), and most recently the *Essentials of Psychological Tele-Assessment* (Wiley, 2021). Additionally, he has conducted research and published widely in the area of social justice in psychology, in particular with LGBTQIA+ communities.

As the current Chair of the American Psychological Association's Board of Educational Affairs, he has worked on and shepherded multiple initiatives in race equity and anti-oppressive work in the field, including work groups on holistic admissions and diversity hiring practices and collaborating on APA's anti-racism resolution. He also participated in the Council of Chairs of Training Councils's summit on social responsiveness in psychology training, with particular focus on liberating the psychology curriculum.
